### **Safe2Say Something - PA Office of Attorney General**

Safe2Say Something is a youth violence prevention program run by the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General. The program teaches youth and adults how to recognize warning signs and signals, especially within social media, from individuals who may be a threat to themselves or others and to “say something” BEFORE it is too late. Anonymous tips may be reported through Safe2Say Something via phone, mobile app, or the website. The Safe2Say Something crisis center reviews and assesses tips to work with school administrators and/or law enforcement for intervention.
