



## 2021 National Preparedness Month Campaign Results

# Last year, we produced "Prepare to Protect," the first-ever national preparedness campaign focusing on the Latino community.

#### PSA Performance in the Last Year:

- \$36.6 million in donated media, resulting in 2.8 billion views of all PSAs.
- Listo.gov/plan
  - All 9 states with highest Latino populations drove traffic.
  - Over 1000% increase in page visits and product downloads.




## Why FEMA invests in youth preparedness.

- Youth are a prime channel to reach households with preparedness messaging.














## **IS-36** Preparedness for Child Care Providers
